CNT Arrests Persons for Illegally Obtaining Controlled Substances

CHATHAM COUNTY, Georgia (May 6, 2019): Two local Chatham County residents are in custody after illegally obtaining controlled substances.

On May 2, 2019, the Chatham-Savannah Counter Narcotics Team (CNT) arrested 39-year-old Brandie Milton also known as Brandie Campbell of Savannah. Milton turned herself in after being informed she was wanted by CNT. Milton was charged with Obtaining a Controlled Substance by Fraud and Criminal Attempt to Obtain a Controlled Substance, both felony charges. Milton was booked into the Chatham County Detention Center and is currently out on bond.

CNT's investigation into Milton began after a local doctor's office contacted CNT due to believing Milton was illegally obtaining controlled substances. During CNT's investigation, it was determined that between April 16 and April 26, she was posing as a medical assistant with her doctor's office for the purpose of illegally obtaining a prescription sleeping medication.

This was not Milton's first arrest by CNT. In April of 2016, Milton was arrested by CNT for a similar case and charged with Attempt or Conspiracy to Violate the Georgia Controlled Substances Act.

In a separate investigation, on May 3, 2019, CNT, with assistance from the Savannah Police Department (SPD) arrested 35-year-old Kristian Fields of Savannah. Fields was arrested at a local pharmacy in Savannah. Fields was charged with Criminal Attempt to Commit a Felony and Obtaining a Controlled Substance by Fraud, both felony charges. Fields remains in the Chatham County Detention Center.

CNT was contacted by the pharmacy after Fields dropped off what the pharmacy believed to be a fraudulent prescription. CNT, with the assistance of the pharmacy

and the would-be prescribing doctor, determined the prescription was fraudulent. CNT also determined Fields was using a false name. It was later determined the false name Fields was using was the name of person who reported their wallet stolen through SPD in August of last year.

This is an ongoing investigation and it is believed Fields was fraudulently distributing prescriptions to others.

CNT would like to thank all the various medical professionals who assisted in this investigation.
