Search Warrant Leads to Seizure of Drugs and Firearms

Chatham County, Georgia (October 9, 2018): Three people are in custody following a search warrant conducted by the Chatham-Savannah Counter Narcotics Team (CNT).

Last night, CNT executed a search warrant at a residence in Wild Horn Plantation located in the 1400 block of King George Boulevard. Inside the residence, agents encountered 21-year-old Malik Gulley, 21-year-old Javonte Ford, and 20-year-old Aimar Marshall, all of Savannah. All persons were taken into custody without incident. The search warrant resulted in the seizure of various forms of controlled substances and items commonly associated with the distribution of controlled substances. Also seized were three firearms, one which returned stolen; two vehicles; and more than \$2,000 in cash. Gulley, Ford, and Marshall were arrested on multiple felony drug and weapon charges. All three remain in the Chatham County Detention Center.

CNT's investigation began in September after CNT received a complaint of possible drug sales occurring at the residence. Through the use of various investigative techniques, agents observed what they believed behavior consistent with drug sales and ultimately obtained a search warrant for the residence.

Said CNT Director Everett Ragan, "This is a prime example of the community getting involved. This investigation began because a concerned citizen had the courage to contact us and report their observations. I want to personally thank that brave individual and encourage others to do the same."
