CIVIL CASE FILING CHECK LIST

When filing with the State Court of Chatham County refer to the following checklist to ensure we process your case/pleadings without delay.	
	Complete a Summons , with name and address of defendant to be served on the Summons, and submit with the complaint (click here for Civil Forms)
	Clerk should have an original summons for the original complaint and a copy for each service copy of the complaint
	If the Clerk is to forward your service to another county, you must submit a second original of the complaint and summons plus a complete copy for every service outside Chatham County. A separate check will be needed to the Sheriff of that county for service, plus an addressed envelope (with adequate postage) to that County's Sheriff or Marshal
	Provide a self-addressed, stamped envelope for any pleadings to be returned to you or for return of the completed Sheriff's service forms
	Complete and submit a <i>Civil Case Information Form</i> to file a lawsuit, file post judgment discovery, file a Magistrate Court Appeal, or to transfer a case
	Complete and submit a <i>Civil Case Final Disposition Form</i> to close a lawsuit or to transfer a case
	Filing a <i>Dispossessory Warrant</i> or a <i>Distress Warrant</i> – take to a State Court Judge first to have signed and then bring to the Clerk's Office to file. The original warrant will be filed in the Clerk's file. A copy to be served with the Sheriff's entry of service and a copy with a stamped envelope to be served on each defendant will be needed, along with the correct filing fee (click here for fee schedule)
	Submit an original plus one copy for the Judge on all motions, responses to motions, notices, or any pleading the Judge is asked to rule upon. Rule 6. Motions in civil actions. 6.1. Filing
	Method of paying for new cases, pleadings, service fees, copies: Cash, Money order, Attorney's Check, Debit Card, Credit Card (VISA, MasterCard, Discover)
