

Where does your wastewater go after you flush?

Wastewater from our homes is treated by **SEPTIC** systems or **SEWER** connections.

Septic systems are comprised of a septic tank and drain field located on the home's property. Septic treatment allows for a home's wastewater to collect in a septic tank to settle solids, then allow water to slowly seap into the home's drain field; this is known as onsite wastewater treatment. **Septic** systems are maintained by the homeowner (for example, use septic safe cleaners and pump every 5yrs).

Sewer connections divert wastewater offsite through a series of sewer pipes to a wastewater treatment facility. **Sewer** connections are maintained by a utility company for which the homeowner pays a fee.

Do you know where your wastewater goes after you flush?







The Chatham County Department of Engineering is updating residential wastewater maps to assist in utility locations. Unincorporated Chatham County (UCC) residents and home owners can help. CCDOE is asking UCC residents and those owning homes in the unincorporated areas to complete the *WASTEWATER SURVEY*. The Wastewater Survey, QR Code below, is simple. The survey asks for the Unincorporated property address and where wastewater flows when a toilet is flushed. If you know your tap water source, that is also important to work towards building a better database on wells in our area.

The Wastewater Survey is OPEN and ready for responses! No need to wait on your postcard!
