GENERAL INFORMATION FOR INVITATION FOR BID/PROPOSAL

This is an invitation to submit a bid or proposal to supply Chatham County with equipment, supplies and/or services as indicated herein. Sealed bids or proposals will be received at the Office of the Purchasing Agent, 1117 EISENHOWER DRIVE SUITE C, Savannah, Georgia, up to 2:00 P.M., 18 November 2010 at which time they will be opened and publicly read. The Purchasing Agent reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive formalities.

Instructions for preparation and submission of a bid or proposal are contained in this Invitation for Bid/Proposal package. Please note that specific forms for submission of a bid/proposal are required. Bids must be typed or printed in ink. If you do not submit a bid/proposal, return the signed bid invitation sheet and state the reason; otherwise, your name may be removed from our bidders list.

A *PREBID CONFERENCE* has been scheduled to be conducted in the Office of the Purchasing Agent, located at the Citizens County Citizens Center, Purchasing and Contracting Department, **Suite C, 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Savannah Georgia, <u>AT 10:00 A.M., 10 November 2010</u> to discuss the specifications and resolve any questions and/or misunderstanding that may arise. You are invited to attend.**

Any changes to the conditions and specifications must be in the form of a written addendum to be valid; therefore, the Purchasing Agent will issue a written addendum to document each approved change. Generally when addenda are required, the bid opening date will be changed.

Chatham County has an equal opportunity purchasing policy. Chatham County seeks to ensure that all segments of the business community have access to supplying the goods and services needed by County programs. The County affirmatively works to encourage utilization of disadvantaged and minority business enterprises in our procurement activities. The County provides equal opportunity for all businesses and does not discriminate against any persons or businesses regardless of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin or handicap. The terms "disadvantaged business," "minority business enterprise," and "minority person" are more specifically defined and explained in the Chatham County Purchasing Ordinance and Procedures Manual, Article VII - Disadvantaged Business Enterprises Program.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS/PROPOSERS

1.1 PURPOSE: The purpose of this document is to provide general and specific information for use in submitting a bid or proposal to supply Chatham County with equipment, supplies, and/or services as described herein. All bids/proposals are governed by the Code of Chatham County, Chapter 4, Article IV, and the laws of the State of Georgia.

1.2 HOW TO PREPARE BID PROPOSALS: All bid proposals shall be:

- Prepared on the forms enclosed herewith, unless otherwise prescribed, and all documents must be submitted.
- B. Typewritten or completed with pen and ink, signed by the business owner or authorized representative, with all erasures or corrections initialed and dated by the official signing the proposal. ALL SIGNATURE SPACES MUST BE SIGNED.

Bidders are encouraged to review carefully all provisions and attachments of this document prior to submission. Each bid constitutes an offer and may not be withdrawn except as provided herein.

1.3 HOW TO SUBMIT BID PROPOSALS: All bid proposals shall be:

- A. Submit an original and one copy in a sealed opaque envelopes, plainly marked with the bid number and title, date and time of bid opening, and company name.
- B. Mailed or delivered as follows in sufficient time to ensure receipt by the Purchasing Agent on or before the time and date specified above.

BIDS NOT RECEIVED BY THE TIME AND DATE SPECIFIED WILL NOT BE OPENED OR CONSIDERED.

- 1.4 HOW TO SUBMIT AN OBJECTION: Objections from bidders to this invitation to bid and/or these specifications should be brought to the attention of the County Purchasing Agent in the following manner:
 - A. When a pre-bid conference is scheduled, bidders shall either present their oral objections at that time or submit their written objections at least two (2) days prior to the scheduled pre-bid conference.
 - B. When a pre-bid conference is not scheduled, the bidder shall submit any objections he may have in writing not less than five (5) days prior to the opening of the bid.
 - C. The objections contemplated may pertain to form and/or substance of the invitation to bid documents. Failure to object in accordance with the above procedure will constitute a waiver on the part of the business to protest this invitation to bid.

- **1.5 FAILURE TO BID:** If a bid is not submitted, the business should return this invitation to bid document, stating reason therefore, and indicate whether the business should be retained or removed from the County's bidders list.
- **ERRORS IN BIDS:** Bidders or their authorized representatives are expected to fully inform themselves as to the conditions, requirements, and specifications before submitting bids. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's own risk. In case of error in extension of prices in the bid, the unit price will govern.
- 1.7 STANDARDS FOR ACCEPTANCE OF BID FOR CONTRACT AWARD: The County reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any irregularities or technicalities in bids received whenever such rejection or waiver is in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to reject the bid of a bidder who has previously failed to perform properly or complete on time contracts of a similar nature, or a bid from a bidder whom investigation shows is not in a position to perform the contract.
- **BID TABULATION:** Tabulations for all bids will be posted for thirty (30) days preceding the bid opening in the Office of the Purchasing and Contracting, 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite C, Savannah, Georgia, 31406 or can be reviewed on the Purchasing web site 24/48 hours after the opening at http://purchasing.chathamcounty.org.
- 1.9 <u>BIDDER:</u> Whenever the term "bidder" is used it shall encompass the "person," "business," "contractor," "supplier," "vendor," or other party submitting a bid or proposal to Chatham County in such capacity before a contract has been entered into between such party and the County.
- 1.10 <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>: The bidder and/or contractor shall obtain and maintain all licenses, permits, liability insurance, workman's compensation insurance and comply with any and all other standards or regulations required by federal, state or County stature, ordinances and rules during the performance of any contract between the contractor and the County. Any such requirement specifically set forth in any contract document between the contractor and the County shall be supplementary to this section and not in substitution thereof.
- 1.11 CONTRACTOR: Contractor or subcontractor means any person or business having a contract with Chatham County. The Contractor/Vendor of goods, material, equipment or services certifies that they will follow equal employment opportunity practices in connection with the awarded contract as more fully specified in the contract documents. Any subcontracting must be specified in the bid/proposal. All Subcontractors must be approved by Chatham County.
- 1.12 LOCAL PREFERENCE: On 27 March, 1998, the Chatham County Board of Commissioners adopted a "Local Vendor" Preference Ordinance that gives the lowest Chatham County vendor submitting a responsible bid/quote the opportunity to match the lowest price offered by an out-of-County vendor. If the County vendor confirms in writing to match within 24 hours, the award will be made to the Chatham County vendor. The lowest Chatham County responsive bidder will be afforded the "right to first refusal". "Local Vendor" is defined as a business or supplier which operates and maintains a regular place of business within the geographical boundaries of Chatham County or one of the local Municipalities of the County AND all real and personal property taxes are paid prior to award of a contract or purchase. "NOT APPLICABLE TO PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS AND REVENUE PRODUCING BIDS."

MINORITY/FEMALE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM: Chatham County Board of Commissioners adopted a policy establishing goals oriented to increase participation of minority and female owned businesses, through MBE/FBE certification and development. In order to accurately document participation, businesses submitting bids, quotes or proposals are encouraged to report ownership status. A minority or female business is defined as a business with 51% or greater minority or female ownership or general management.

A bidder or vendor that is certified by any agency of the Federal Government or State of Georgia may submit a copy of their certification with their bid as proof of qualifications.

Bidders that intend to engage in joint ventures or utilize sub-consultants must submit to the County Contract Administrator, a report on Minority/Female Business Enterprise participation. If available and utilized, the goals for this Contract are 7% Minority and 5% Female participation.

GENERAL TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND EXCEPTIONS

- **2.1 CONTRACT COMMITMENT:** This Bid/RFP does not commit Chatham County to award a contract, to issue a purchase order, or to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of a bid proposal in response to this request.
- 2.2 GEORGIA OPEN RECORDS ACT: Bid responses will become part of the County's official files without any obligation on the County's part. Ownership of all data, materials, and documentation prepared for and submitted to Chatham County in response to a solicitation, regardless of the type, shall belong exclusively to Chatham County and will be considered a record prepared, maintained, or received in the course of operations of a public office or public agency and is subject to public inspection in accordance with the Georgia Open Records Act, Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Section 50-18-070, et. Sec., unless otherwise provided by law.
- **GEORGIA TRADE SECRET ACT OF 1990:** In the event that a Bidder submits trade secret information to the County, the information must be clearly labeled as a "Trade Secret". The County will maintain the confidentiality of such trade secrets to the extent provided by law.
- 2.4 <u>CONTRACTOR RECORDS</u>: The Georgia Open Records Act is applicable to the records of all Contractors and Subcontractors under contract with the County. This applies to contracts currently in effect and those which have been completed or closed for up to a period of three (3) years following completion. Again, this is contract specific to the County contracts only.
- 2.5 <u>INTERPRETING SPECIFICATIONS</u>: The specifications or scope of services contained herein are intended to be descriptive rather than restrictive. The County is soliciting a bid proposal to provide a complete product or service package which meets overall requirements. Specific equipment and system references may be included in the IFB for guidance, but they are not intended to preclude bidders from recommending alternative solutions for offering comparable or better performance or value to the County. Unless specifically stated otherwise with regard to a specific item of equipment, it should be assumed for this product to be supported by a manufacturer's warranty which is equal or better than the prevailing standard in the industry.

Any obvious error or omission in specifications shall not inure to the benefit of the bidder, but shall put the bidder on notice to inquire or identify the same from the County. Whenever herein mention is made of any article, material or workmanship to in accordance with laws, ordinances, building codes, underwriter's codes, ASTM regulations or similar expressions, the

requirements of these laws, ordinances, etc., shall be construed to be the minimum requirements of these specifications.

Changes in the scope of services, specifications, or terms and conditions of the IFB will be made in writing by the County prior to the bid opening or due date. Results of informal meetings or discussions between a potential bidder and a County official or employee may not be used as a basis for deviations from the requirements contained in this solicitation.

- 2.6 <u>DEBARRED FIRMS, INDICTMENTS AND PENDING LITIGATIONS:</u> Any potential proposer/firm listed on the Federal, State of Georgia or any government entity, Excluded Parties Listing (Barred from doing business) will not be considered for contract award. Proposers shall disclose any record of pending criminal violations (Indictment) and/or convictions, pending lawsuits, etc., and any actions that may be a conflict of interest occurring within the last five (5) years. Any proposer/firm previously defaulting or terminating a contract with the County will be not considered.
 - ** All bidders or proposers are to read and complete the **Disclosure of Responsibility Statement** enclosed as an Attachment to be returned with response. Failure to do so may result in your solicitation response being rejected as non-responsive.

Bidder acknowledges that in performing contract for the Board, bidder shall not utilize any firms that have been a party of any of the above actions. If Bidder has engaged any firm to work on this contract or project that is later debarred, Bidder shall sever its relationship with that firm with respect to Board contract.

- 2.7 MULTIPLE BIDS: No vendor will be allowed to submit more than one bid. Any alternative proposals must be brought to the Purchasing Agent's attention during the pre-bid conference or submitted to in writing at lease five (5) days preceding the bid opening date.
- **BID FOR ALL OR PART:** Unless otherwise specified by Chatham County or the bidder, CHATHAM COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MAKE AWARD ON ALL ITEMS, OR ON ANY OF THE ITEMS ACCORDING TO THE BEST INTEREST OF CHATHAM COUNTY. Bidder may restrict his bid to consideration in the aggregate by so stating, but must name a unit price on each item bid upon.
- **2.9 BID ACCEPTANCE PERIOD:** Bidder warrants that bid prices, terms and conditions quoted in his bid will be firm for acceptance for a period of sixty (60) days from bid opening date, unless otherwise stated in the bid.
- **2.10** COMPLETENESS: All information required by Invitation for Bids/Proposals must be completed and submitted to constitute a proper bid or proposal.
- **QUALITY:** All materials, or supplies used for the construction necessary to comply with this proposal shall be of the best quality, and of the highest standard of workmanship.
 - Workmanship employed in any construction, repair, or installation required by this proposal shall be of the highest quality and meet recognized standards within the respective trades, crafts and of the skills employed.
- **QUARANTEE:** Unless otherwise specified by the County, the bidder shall unconditionally guarantee the materials and workmanship on all material and/or services. If, within the guarantee period any defects occur which are due to faulty material and or services, the contractor at his expense, shall repair or adjust the condition, or replace the material and/or services to the complete satisfaction of the County. These repairs, replacement or adjustments shall be made only at such time as will be designed by the County as being least detrimental to the operation of County business.

- 2.13 <u>LIABILITY PROVISIONS</u>: Where bidders are required to enter or go onto Chatham County property to take measurements or gather other information in order to prepare the bid or proposal as requested by the County, the bidder shall be liable for any injury, damage or loss occasioned by negligence of the bidder, his agent, or any person the bidder has designated to prepare the bid and shall indemnify and hold harmless Chatham County from any liability arising therefrom. The contract document specifies the liability provisions required of the successful bidder in order to be awarded a contract with Chatham County.
- 2.14 <u>CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT</u>: The contract may be canceled or suspended by Chatham County in whole or in part by written notice of default to the Contractor upon non-performance or violation of contract terms. An award may be made to the next low bidder, for articles and/or services specified or they may be purchased on the open market and the defaulting Contractor (or his surety) shall be liable to Chatham County for costs to the County in excess of the defaulted contract prices. See the contract documents for complete requirements.
- 2.15 PATENT INDEMNITY: Except as otherwise provided, the successful bidder agrees to indemnify Chatham County and its officers, agents and employees against liability, including costs and expenses for infringement upon any letters patent of the United States arising out of the performance of this Contract or out of the use or disposal for the account of the County of supplies furnished or construction work performed hereunder.
- **2.16 CERTIFICATION OF INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION:** By submission of this bid, the bidder certifies, and in the case of a joint bid each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, that in connection with this procurement:
 - The prices in this bid have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication, or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices with any other bidder or with any competitor;
 - 2. Unless otherwise required by law, the prices which have been quoted in this bid have not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder and will not knowingly be disclosed by the bidder prior to opening, directly or indirectly to any other bidder or to any competitor; and;
 - 3. No attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to induce any other person or firm to submit or not be submit a bid for the purpose or restricting competition.
- **AWARD OF CONTRACT:** The contract, if awarded, will be awarded to that responsible bidder whose bid/proposal will be most advantageous to Chatham County, price and other factors considered. The Board of Commissioners will make the determination as to which bid or proposal best serves the interest of Chatham County. **Appeal of an award can only be made after the Board of Commissioner's award a contract.**
- 2.18 PROCUREMENT PROTESTS: Objections and protests to any portion of the procurement process or actions of the County staff may be filed with the Purchasing Agent for review and resolution. The Chatham County Purchasing Procedures Manual, Article IX Appeals and Remedies shall govern the review and resolution of all protests.

- QUALIFICATION OF BUSINESS (RESPONSIBLE BIDDER OR PROPOSER): A responsible bidder or proposer is defined as one who meets, or by the date of the bid acceptance can meet, all requirements for licensing, insurance, and service contained within this Invitation for Bids or Proposals. Chatham County has the right to require any or all bidders to submit documentation of the ability to perform, provide, or carry out the service or provide the product requested.
 - Chatham County has the right to disqualify the bid or proposal of any bidder or proposer as being unresponsive or unresponsible whenever such bidder/proposer cannot document the ability to deliver the requested product.
- 2.20 <u>COUNTY TAX CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENT</u>: Contractor must supply a copy of their Tax Certificate as proof of payment of the occupational tax where their office is located. Please contact the Chatham County Department of Building and Regulatory Services at (912) 201-4300 for additional information. No contract shall be awarded unless all real and personal property taxes have been paid by the successful contractor and/or subcontractors as adopted by the Board of Commissioners on April 9, 1994.
- 2.21 <u>INSURANCE PROVISIONS</u>: The selected CONTRACTOR shall be required to procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Bid. Contract work will not proceed unless Chatham County has in their possession, a current Certificate of Insurance.
 - 2.21.1 General Information that shall appear on a Certificate of Insurance:
 - I. Name of the Producer (Contractor's insurance Broker/Agent).
 - II. Companies affording coverage (there may be several).
 - III. Name and Address of the Insured (this should be the Company or Parent of the firm Chatham County is contracting with).
 - IV. A Summary of all current insurance for the insured (includes effective dates of coverage).
 - V. A brief description of the operations to be performed, the specific job to be performed, or contract number
 - VI. Certificate Holder (This is to always include Chatham County).
 - 2.21.2 Minimum Limits of Insurance to be maintained for the duration of the contract:
 - A. Commercial General Liability: Provides protection against bodily injury and property damage claims arising from operations of a Contractor or Tenant. This policy cl coverage includes: premises and operations, use of independent contractors, products/completed operations, personal injury, contractual, broad form property damage, and underground, explosion and collapse hazards. Minimum limits: \$1,000,000 bodily injury and property damage per occurrence and annual aggregate.
 - B. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability: Provides statutory protection against bodily injury, sickness or disease sustained by employees of the Contractor while performing within the scope of their duties. Employer's Liability coverage is usually included in Worker's Compensation policies, and insures common law claims of injured employees made in lieu of or in addition to a Worker's Compensation claim. Minimum limits: \$500,000 for each accident, disease policy limit, disease each employee and Statutory Worker's Compensation limit.
 - C. Business Automobile Liability: Coverage insures against liability claims arising out of the Contractor's

use of automobiles. Minimum limit: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage. Coverage should be written on an "Any Auto" basis.

2.21.3 Special Requirements:

- A. Claims-Made Coverage: The limits of liability shall remain the same as the occurrence basis, however, the Retroactive date shall be prior to the coincident with the date of any contract, and the Certificate of Insurance shall state the coverage is claims-made. The Retroactive date shall also be specifically stated on the Certificate of Insurance.
- B. **Extended Reporting Periods**: The Contractor shall provide the County with a notice of the election to initiate any Supplemental Extended Reporting Period and the reason(s) for invoking this option.
- C. **Reporting Provisions:** Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided in relation to this request.
- D. Cancellation: Each insurance policy that applies to this request shall be endorsed to state that it shall not be suspended, voided, or canceled, except after thirty (30) days prior to written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
- E. **Proof of Insurance:** Chatham County shall be furnished with certificates of insurance and with original endorsements affecting coverage required by this request. The certificates and endorsements are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. All certificates of insurance are to be submitted prior to, and approved by, the County before services are rendered. The Contractor must ensure Certificate of Insurance is updated for the entire term of the County.
- F. **Insurer Acceptability:** Insurance is to be placed with an insurer having an A.M. Best's rating of A and a five (5) year average financial rating of not less than V. If an insurer does not qualify for averaging on a five year basis, the current total Best's rating will be used to evaluate insurer acceptability.
- G. Lapse in Coverage: A lapse in coverage shall constitute grounds for contract termination by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners.
- H. Deductibles and Self-Insured Retention: Any deductibles or self-insured retention must be declared to, and approved by, the County. At the option of the County, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retention as related to the County, its officials, officers, employees, and volunteers; or the Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of related suits, losses, claims, and related investigation, claim administration and defense expenses.
- 2.22 COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIFICATION TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND EXCEPTIONS: The Invitation to Bid, Legal Advertisement, General Conditions and Instructions to Bidders, Specifications, Special Conditions, Vendor's Bid, Addendum, and/or any other pertinent documents from a part of the bidders proposal or bid and by reference are made a part hereof.
- **2.23 SIGNED BID CONSIDERED OFFER:** The signed bid shall be considered an offer on the part of the bidder, which offer shall be deemed accepted upon approval by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners, Purchasing Agent or his

designee. In case of a default on the part of the bidder after such acceptance, Chatham County may take such action as it deems appropriate, including legal action for damages or lack of required performance.

1.0 CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS:

- 1.1 The contract period will be for a period of one (1) year with automatic renewal options for four (4) additional one year terms, if all parties agree. Commission revenue rates are to remain fixed for contract duration.

The purpose of vending in these areas is to provide the public with refreshments in a convenient and easily accessible location. The Successful Contractor will furnish, maintain and stock/replenish electronic snack and beverage vending machines with dollar validation for the purpose of dispensing candy, snacks, sodas and juices. It should be noted that Chatham County maintains separate contracts for concession operations (includes some vending machines) at Tybee Pier and several athletic complexes (Memorial Stadium, Soccer Complex, Lake Mayer Park, Charles Brooks Park, L. Scott Stell Park and Jim Golden Park). Services for these facilities are exclusive to the current contractors and will not be included in this contract.

The County does not have overall volume or revenue date for comparative purposes. Machines currently installed are provided from a variety of sources.

4.0 FOOD AND BEVERAGE REQUIREMENTS:

4.1 Bidder must provide, with bid submittal, a complete list of snack products to be furnished along with a list of beverages available. Low fat and fruit products, if available, should be included with the bid. All food and food products specified shall be processed, packaged and delivered in accordance with the regulations, laws and standards of Chatham County, the State of Georgia, the USDA and the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. A copy of the nutritional analysis for each product sold in the machines must be maintained on file at the vending machine services facility and presented to a County representative upon request.

5.0 BID REVENUE OPTIONS:

5.1 The County will consider various options involving revenue generated to the County under this contract. Two (2) of the County facilities, the Chatham County Aquatic Center and the Anderson / Cohen Weightlifting Center shall each be stated separately. All options to the standard commission fee structure will be considered. Each bid shall clearly define the fee to be paid and the basis for its calculation. Bid options to be provided include:

Option 1: Commission: A sum equal to a fixed percentage of gross retail sales paid on a monthly basis.

Option 2: Flat Rate Plus Commission: A minimum of fixed sum of money payable on a monthly basis and

a fixed percentage of gross retail sales combined.

Option 3: Flat Rate: A minimum fixed sum of money payable (monthly) to the County regardless of level

of activity.

In return for exclusive rights to the vending services at the listed County locations, Contractor will be responsible for collecting and accounting for all money receipts from each machine, and will remit to the County on a monthly basis a sum equal to the proposed fee method. All fees will be paid to the County on a monthly basis, no later than the 15th day of the following month in which actual sales occurred. A 10% late fee will be due and payable if fee payments are not received by the due date.

The Successful Contractor will be responsible for all sales tax, licenses, fees, etc. and will not deduct such from the commission owed to the County. The proposer will also be responsible for obtaining and maintaining all permits and licenses for operation of its equipment in County-owned facilities.

6.0 REPORTS REQUIREMENTS:

6.1 Successful Contractor will provide, on a monthly basis, reports detailing gross retail sales by machine, a list by each product's sales, and/or beginning and ending reading of transaction counters. The County reserves the right to audit the sales records and invoices pertaining to the County's account.

7.0 MACHINE REQUIREMENTS:

- 7.1 Current sites to be serviced and potential sites for service are a stated herein in Section 3.0 (Page 17). Potential sites where service may be added may be suggested by the contractor and will be reviewed by the County's designated representative. Types of machines are to remain the same unless other options are proposed by the bidder. Bidders are encouraged to visit all locations to become familiar with the physical conditions surrounding the areas and become acquainted with establishing operations in other areas.
- 7.2 Each bidder will provide with bid submission, descriptive literature with full illustrations and detailed specifications for each vending machine offered. Title to all equipment and product shall remain with the Successful Contractor.

8.0 RATES:

8.1 Retail prices for products shall be comparable to those charged for similar facilities within Chatham County while allowing the successful Contractor to realize a reasonable profit.

9.0 PERSONNEL:

9.1 The successful Contractor will be responsible for providing qualified personnel to service and fill the machines on a regular basis. Contractor will comply with all requirements of federal, state and local laws. Contractor will require their employees to observe all applicable rules and regulations and to exercise courtesy and consideration in their service to the County. Employees shall wear a uniform or identification badge to show they are employees of the vendor.

10.0 STOCKING AND REFUNDS:

10.1 Restocking of machines shall occur on a regular basis during standard hours of operation at each County facility.

The Successful Contractor will respond within 24 hours of request to any County facility for restocking when it is deemed necessary. Contractor will also be responsible for all refunds. A standard procedure for refunds should be submitted with bid submittal.

11.0 IMPLEMENTATION TIME FRAME:

11.1 Chatham County desires for this project to be completed as quickly as possible. A detailed project timetable is to be provided by the contractor to the designated representative within 15 days of award. Installation of machines should be complete within 30 days of award.

12.0 INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS:

12.1 Successful Contractor will be responsible for the delivery and installation of all equipment to locations as determined at the beginning of the contract. Existing services of electricity supplied to the current vending areas, as well as custodial services, will be provided by the County. However, the Contractor is expected to maintain all machines in a clean, sanitary and safe condition.

13.0 MAINTENANCE AND SERVICE RESPONSE:

- 13.1 Successful Contractor will be responsible for maintaining all equipment in good, working order. The Contractor will have trained competent repair persons available within the time stated on the bid sheet of this solicitation package (Page 20). Bidder will provide a description of guaranteed response time during all operating hours, including weekends and holidays and will provide phone numbers and contact persons at each machine location.
