This is an invitation to submit a proposal to supply Chatham County with services as indicated herein. Sealed proposals will be received at the Office of the Purchasing Agent, **1117 EISENHOWER DRIVE, SUITE C, SAVANNAH, GEORGIA** up to **2:00 P.M. MARCH 21, 2019**. Responses must either be mailed or delivered to the Purchasing Office. The Purchasing Director reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and to waive formalities.

Instructions for preparation and submission of a proposal are contained in the Request for Proposals package. Please note that specific forms for submission of a proposal are required. Proposals must be typed or printed in ink. If you do not submit a qualification proposal, return the signed invitation sheet and state the reason; otherwise, your name may be removed from our list.

A pre-proposal conference has been scheduled for 2:00 P.M. MARCH 7, 2019 and will be held at the Chatham County Purchasing & Contract Department at 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite C, Savannah, Georgia. Your attendance is welcome and recommended.

Any changes to the conditions and specifications must be in the form of a written addendum to be valid; therefore, the Purchasing Director will issue a written addendum to document approved changes. Generally when addenda are required, the bid opening date will be changed.

Chatham County has an equal opportunity procurement policy. Chatham County seeks to ensure that all segments of the business community have access to providing services needed by County programs. The County affirmatively works to encourage utilization of disadvantaged and minority business enterprises in our procurement activities. The County provides equal opportunity for all businesses and does not discriminate against any persons or businesses regardless of race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin or handicap. The County expects its contractors to make maximum feasible use of minority businesses and qualified minority employees. The terms "disadvantaged business", "minority business enterprise", and "minority person" are more specifically defined and explained in the <u>Chatham County Purchasing</u> Ordinance and Procedures Manual, Article VII - Disadvantaged Business Enterprises Program.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

1.1 Purpose: The purpose of this document is to provide general and specific information for use in submitting a proposal to supply Chatham County with services as described herein. All proposals are governed by the <u>Code of Chatham County</u>, Chapter 4, Article IV, and the laws of the State of Georgia.

1.2 How to Prepare Proposals: All proposals shall be:

A. Typewritten or completed with pen and ink, signed by the business owner or authorized representative, with all erasures or corrections initialed and dated by the official signing the proposal. ALL SIGNATURE SPACES MUST BE SIGNED.

Proposers are encouraged to review carefully all provisions and attachments of this document prior to submission. Each proposal constitutes an offer and may not be withdrawn except as provided herein.

1.3 How to Submit Proposals: All proposals shall be:

A. Submitted in sealed opaque envelopes, plainly marked with the proposal number and title, date and time for submission, and company name.

- **B.** Mailed or delivered as follows in sufficient time to ensure receipt by the Purchasing Agent on or before the time and date specified above.
 - a. Mailing Address: Purchasing Director, 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite C, Savannah, Georgia 314066.
 - b. Hand Delivery: Purchasing Director, 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite C, Savannah, Georgia.

PROPOSALS NOT RECEIVED BY THE TIME AND DATE SPECIFIED WILL NOT BE OPENED OR CONSIDERED. However, if a well justified request to delay receipt of proposals is received at least one work day before proposal due date, it will be considered.

- **1.4 How to Submit an Objection:** Objections from Offerers to this Request for Proposals and/or these specifications should be brought to the attention of the County Purchasing Director in the following manner:
 - A. When a pre-proposal conference is scheduled, the Proposer may object in writing any time prior to or at the pre-proposal conference.
 - B. When a pre-proposal conference is not scheduled, the Proposer shall object in writing not less than five (5) days prior to the Date for submission.

- C. The objections contemplated must pertain both to form and substance of the Request for Proposal documents. Failure to object in accordance with the above procedure will constitute a waiver on the part of the business to protest this Request for Proposal.
- **1.5** <u>Errors in Proposals</u>: Proposers or their authorized representatives are expected to fully inform themselves as to the conditions, requirements, and specifications before submitting proposals. Failure to do so will be at the Proposer's own risk.
- **1.6** <u>Standards for Acceptance of Proposers for Contract Award:</u> The County reserves the right to reject any or all Proposals and to waive any irregularities or technicalities in Proposals received whenever such rejection or waiver is in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to reject the Offer of a Proposer who has previously failed to perform properly or complete on time contracts of a similar nature, whom investigation shows is not in a position to perform the contract.
- **1.7 Proposer:** Whenever the term "Proposer" is used it shall encompass the "person", "business", "firm", or other party submitting a proposal to Chatham County in such capacity before a contract has been entered into between such party and the County.
- **1.8** <u>**Compliance with Laws:**</u> The Proposer shall obtain and maintain all licenses, permits, liability insurance, workman's compensation insurance and comply with any and all other standards or regulations required by federal, state or County statute, ordinances and rules during the performance of any contract between the Proposer and the County. Any such requirement specifically set forth in any contract document between the Proposer and the County shall be supplementary to this section and not in substitution thereof.
- **1.9 Consultant:** Consultant or sub-consultant means any person, firm, or business having a contract with Chatham County. The Consultant of design/engineering services certifies that the firm will follow equal employment opportunity practices in connection with the awarded contract as more fully specified in the contract documents.
- **1.10 Local Preference:** The Consultant agrees to follow the local preference guidelines as more fully specified in the contract documents.
- **1.11** Debarred Firms and Pending Litigation: Any potential Proposer/Firm listed on the Federal or State of Georgia Excluded Parties Listing (Barred from doing business) will not be considered for contract award. Proposers shall disclose any record of pending criminal violations (Indictment) and/or convictions, pending lawsuits, etc., and any actions that may be a conflict of interest occurring within the past five (5) years. Any Proposer/Firm previously defaulting or terminating a contract with the County will not be considered.

** All proposers are to read and complete the Disclosure of Responsibility Statement enclosed as an Attachment to be returned with response. Failure to do so may result in

your solicitation response being rejected as non-responsive.

Proposer acknowledges that in performing contract work for the Board, bidder shall not utilize any firms that have been a party to any of the above actions. If Proposer has engaged any firm to work on this contract or project that is later debarred, Proposer shall sever its relationship with that firm with respect to Board contract.

1.12 Performance Evaluation: On April 11, 2008, the Chatham County Board of Commissioners approved a change to the County Purchasing Ordinance requiring Consultant Performance Evaluations, as a minimum, annually, prior to contract anniversary date.

Should Consultant performance be unsatisfactory, the appointed County Project Manager for the contract may prepare a Contractor/Consultant Complaint Form or a Performance Evaluation to the County Purchasing Director.

PROPOSAL CONDITIONS

- **2.1 Specifications:** Any obvious error or omission in specifications shall not inure to the benefit of the Proposer but shall put the Proposer on notice to inquire of or identify the same to the County.
- **2.2** <u>Multiple Proposals:</u> No Proposer will be allowed to submit more than one offer. Any alternate proposals must be brought to the Purchasing Agent's attention during the Pre-proposal Conference or submitted in writing at least five (5) days preceding the date for submission of proposals.
- **2.3** <u>Offers to be Firm</u>: The Proposer warrants that terms and conditions quoted in his offer will be firm for acceptance for a period of sixty (60) days from bid date submitted, unless otherwise stated in the proposal. When requested to provide a fee proposal, fees quoted must also be firm for a sixty day period.
- **2.4** <u>**Completeness:**</u> All information required by the Request for Proposals must be completed and submitted to constitute a proper proposal.
- 2.5 <u>Liability Provisions</u>: Where Proposers are required to enter or go into Chatham County property to take measurements or gather other information in order to prepare the proposal as requested by the County, the Proposer shall be liable for any injury, damage or loss occasioned by negligence of the Proposer, his agent, or any person the Proposer has designated to prepare the Offer and shall indemnify and hold harmless Chatham County from any liability arising therefrom. The contract document specifies the liability provisions required of the successful Proposer in order to be awarded a contract with Chatham County.
- 2.6 <u>Award of Contract</u>: The contract, if awarded, will be awarded to that responsible Proposer whose proposal will be most advantageous to Chatham County. The Board of Commissioners will make the determination as to which proposal best serves the interest of Chatham County.
- 2.7 <u>Procurement Protests:</u> Objections and protests to any portion of the procurement process or actions of the County staff may be filed with the <u>Purchasing Agent</u> for review and resolution. The <u>Chatham County Purchasing Procedures Manual</u>. Article IX Appeals and Remedies shall govern the review and resolution of all protests.
- **2.8 Qualification of Business (Responsible Proposer):** A responsible Proposer is defined as one who meets, or by the date of the acceptance can meet, all requirements for licensing, insurance, and service contained within this Request for Proposals. Chatham County has the right to require any or all Proposers to submit documentation of the ability to perform the service requested.

Chatham County has the right to disqualify the proposal of any Proposer as being

unresponsive or irresponsible whenever such Proposer cannot document the ability to deliver the requested service.

2.9 <u>County Tax Certificate Requirement:</u> Consultant must supply a copy of their Tax Certificate as proof of payment of the occupational tax where their office is located. Please contact the County Building Safety and Regulatory Services (912) 201-4300 for additional information.

No contract shall be awarded unless all real and personal property taxes have been paid by the successful consultant and/or sub-consultant as adopted by the Board of Commissioners on April 8, 1994.

- 2.10 <u>Insurance Provisions, General:</u> The selected CONSULTANT shall be required to procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Consultant, his agents, representatives, employees or sub-consultants. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Bid. It is every consultant's responsibility to provide the County Purchasing and Contracting Division current and up-to-date Certificates of Insurance for multiple year contracts before the end of each term. Failure to do so may be cause for termination of contract.
 - 2.10.1 General Information that shall appear on a Certificate of Insurance:

I. Name of the Producer (Consultant's insurance Broker/Agent).

II. Companies affording coverage (there may be several).

III. Name and Address of the Insured (this should be the Company or Parent of the firm Chatham County is contracting with).

IV. Summary of all current insurance for the insured (includes effective dates of coverage).

V. A brief description of the operations to be performed, the specific job to be performed, or contract number.

VI. Certificate Holder (This is to always include Chatham County).

Chatham County as an "Additional Insured": Chatham County invokes the defense of "sovereign immunity." In order not to jeopardize the use of this defense, the County <u>is not</u> to be included as an "Additional Insured" on insurance contracts.

2.10.2 Minimum Limits of Insurance to be maintained for the duration of the contract:

A. **Commercial General Liability:** Provides protection against bodily injury and property damage claims arising from operations of a Consultant or Tenant. This policy coverage includes: premises and operations, use of independent consultants, products/completed operations, personal injury, contractual, broad form property damage, and underground, explosion and collapse hazards.

Minimum limits: \$1,000,000 bodily injury and property damage per occurrence and annual aggregate.

- B. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability: Provides statutory protection against bodily injury, sickness or disease sustained by employees of the Consultant while performing within the scope of their duties. Employer's Liability coverage is usually included in Worker's Compensation policies, and insures common law claims of injured employees made in lieu of or in addition to a Worker's Compensation claim. Minimum limits: \$500,000 for each accident., disease policy limit, disease each employee and Statutory Worker's Compensation limit.
- C. **Business Automobile Liability:** Coverage insures against liability claims arising out of the Consultant's use of automobiles. Minimum limit: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage. Coverage should be written on an "Any Auto" basis.

2.10.3 Special Requirements:

- A. **Claims-Made Coverage:** The limits of liability shall remain the same as the occurrence basis, however, the retroactive date shall be prior to the coincident with the date of any contract, and the Certificate of Insurance shall state the coverage is claims-made. The retroactive date shall also be specifically stated on the Certificate of Insurance.
- B. **Extended Reporting Periods**: The Consultant shall provide the County with a notice of the election to initiate any Supplemental Extended Reporting Period and the reason(s) for invoking this option.
- C. **Reporting Provisions:** Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided in relation to this request.
- D. **Cancellation:** Each insurance policy that applies to this request shall be endorsed to state that it shall not be suspended, voided, or canceled, except after thirty (30) days prior to written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
- E. **Proof of Insurance:** Chatham County shall be furnished with certificates of insurance and with original endorsements affecting coverage required by this request. The certificates and endorsements are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. All certificates of insurance are to be submitted prior to, and approved by, the County before services are rendered. The Consultant must ensure Certificate of Insurance are updated for the entire term of the County.

- F. **Insurer Acceptability:** Insurance is to be placed with an insurer having an A.M. Best's rating of A and a five (5) year average financial rating of not less than V. If an insurer does not qualify for averaging on a five year basis, the current total Best's rating will be used to evaluate insurer acceptability.
- G. Lapse in Coverage: A lapse in coverage shall constitute grounds for contract termination by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners.
- H. **Deductibles and Self-Insured Retention**: Any deductibles or self-insured retention must be declared to, and approved by, the County. At the option of the County, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retention as related to the County, its officials, officers, employees, and volunteers; or the Consultant shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of related suits, losses, claims, and related investigation, claim administration and defense expenses.

2.10.4 Additional Coverage for Specific Procurement Projects:

I. **Professional Liability:** Insure errors or omission on behalf of architects, engineers, attorneys, medical professionals, and consultants.

Minimum Limits:	\$1 million per claim/occurrence.
Coverage Requirement:	If "claims-made," retroactive date must
	precede or coincide with the contract
	effective date or the date of the Notice to

Indemnification. The CONSULTANT agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold 2.11 harmless Chatham County, Georgia, its commissioners, officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all liability, damages, claims, suits, liens, and judgments, of whatever nature, including claims for contribution and/or indemnification, for injuries to or death of any person or persons, or damage to the property or other rights of any person or persons caused by the CONSULTANT or its sub-consultants. The CONSULTANT's obligation to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless, as set forth herein above shall include, but not be limited to, any matter arising out of any actual or alleged infringement of any patent, trademark, copyright, or service mark, or any actual or alleged unfair competition, disparagement of product or service, or other business tort of any type whatsoever, or any actual or alleged violation of trade regulations. CONSULTANT further agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for, and to protect. defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Chatham County. Georgia, at his sole expense, and agrees to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto, even if such claims, suits, etc., are groundless, false, or fraudulent, including any and all claims or liability for compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act arising out of injuries sustained by

any employee of the CONSULTANT or his subcontractors or anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them.

The CONSULTANT's obligation to indemnify Chatham County under this Section shall not be limited in any way by the agreed-upon contract price, or to the scope and amount of coverage provided by any insurance maintained by the CONSULTANT.

- 2.12 <u>Compliance with Specification Terms and Conditions</u>: The Request for Proposals, Legal Advertisement, General Conditions and Instructions to Proposers, Specifications, Special Conditions, Proposers Offer, Addendum, and/or any other pertinent documents form a part of the Offeror's proposal and by reference are made a part hereof.
- 2.13 <u>Signed Response Considered An Offer:</u> The signed Response shall be considered an offer on the part of the Proposer, which offer shall be deemed accepted upon approval by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners, Purchasing Agent or his designee. In case of a default on the part of the Proponent after such acceptance, Chatham County may take such action as it deems appropriate, including legal action for damages or lack of required performance.
- 2.14 <u>Notice to Proceed</u>: The successful Proposer shall not commence work under this Request for Proposal until a written contract is awarded and a Notice to Proceed is issued by the Purchasing Agent or his designee. If the successful Proposer does commence any work or deliver items prior to receiving official notification, he does so at his own risk.
- **2.15** <u>**Payment to Consultant:**</u> Instructions for invoicing the County for service delivered to the County are specified in the contract document.
 - A. Questions regarding payment may be directed to the Finance Department at (912)
 652-7905 or the County's Project Manager as specified in the contract documents.
 - B. Consultants will be paid the agreed upon compensation upon satisfactory progress or completion of the work as more fully described in the contract document.
 - C. Upon completion of the work, the Consultant will provide the County with an affidavit certifying all suppliers, persons or businesses employed by the Consultant for the work performed for the County have been paid in full.
 - D. Chatham County is a tax exempt entity. Every consultant, contractor, vendor, business or person under contract with Chatham County is required by Georgia law to pay State sales or use taxes for products purchased in Georgia or transported into Georgia and sold to Chatham County by contract. Please consult the State of Georgia, Department of Revenue, Sales and Use Tax Unit in Atlanta (404) 656-4065 for additional information.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

GENERAL CONDITIONS SECTION III

Chatham County is requesting proposals from qualified firms to perform On Call Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Services for Chatham County, Georgia. The County presents this "Request for Proposals" to describe its needs and those criteria which will be used to determine selection of services. Contracts will be for one (1) year with automatic renewal options for four (4) additional one (1) year terms with total fees not to exceed \$250,000 per year for each successful consulting firm. Multiple contracts may be awarded.

3.1 <u>METHODOLOGY</u>. The procurement described herein is being conducted as a Request for Proposals through <u>professional services selection</u>, a method of selecting professional services as provided in <u>The Chatham County Purchasing Ordinance and Procedures</u> <u>Manual</u>. This will be a three-step selection process, a summary of which follows:

STEP 1/ ACCEPTANCE AND EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS: All technical requirements, unless otherwise specified, must be met by the Proposer. The goal of Step 1 will be to accept, evaluate and score qualification proposals that meet technical requirements and develop a "short list" that represent the <u>best</u> of all proposals.

-In the interest of a fair, objective and competitive process, Chatham County intends to accept all qualified proposals and give them complete and impartial consideration.

-Any proposal which does not meet all technical requirements may be disqualified as being non-responsive.

- Proposals which are deemed to be incomplete as to substance and content may be returned without consideration. Proponents whose proposals are not accepted will be promptly notified that they are not being further considered and why.

-Recommending proponents that best qualify for the short list will be done through a committee evaluation process based on established technical criteria as described herein. Final decision on the staff's recommendation is made by the Board of Commissioners.

STEP 2/INTERVIEWS: The evaluation committee **may** interview each finalist firm. If interviews are conducted, they will be scored. It will be at the discretion of the evaluation committee on the number of firms that will be interviewed .

FINAL SELECTION: Upon completion of the selection process by the evaluation committee, the firms will be ranked in order of recommendation using the sum of individual rankings from the evaluation committee members.

The committee will select up to four firms who provide the most favorable

combinations of experience, qualifications, management, and proven ability to produce deliverables "on time and within budget".

- 3.2 <u>PRE-PROPOSAL CONFERENCE.</u> A pre-proposal conference will be held at <u>2:00</u> <u>P.M. on MARCH 7, 2019</u>, at the Chatham County Purchasing & Contract Department at 1117 Eisenhower Drive, Suite C, Savannah, Georgia. Representatives from Chatham County will be in attendance. Attendance assures that all competitors hear the same information, can ask questions and suggest constructive changes to the solicitation.
- **3.3 PROPOSAL DEADLINE.** The response to this 'Request for Proposal' must be received by the Purchasing Division no later than **2:00 P.M. MARCH 21, 2019.** Any proposal received after the time stipulated will be rejected and returned unopened to the proponent.
- **3.4** <u>WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL.</u> Any proposal submitted before the deadline may be withdrawn by written request received by the County before the time fixed for receipt of qualification proposals. Withdrawal of any proposal will not prejudice the right of a proponent to submit a new or amended proposal as long as Chatham County receives it by the deadline as provided herein.
- **3.5 CONFIDENTIALITY OF DOCUMENTS.** Upon receipt of a proposal by the County, the proposal shall become the property of the County without compensation to the proponent, for disposition or usage by the County at its discretion (except for as provided by Georgia law for proprietary information). The details of the qualification proposal documents will remain confidential until final award or rejection of proposals and/or protected under the restraints of law.
- **3.6 FORMAT OF RESPONSES.** To be considered, proponents must submit a complete response to the request for proposals. The format for responses is presented in Section 2. All responses must be presented in this format, which will not be negotiable.

- **3.8** COSTS TO PREPARE RESPONSES. The County assumes no responsibility nor obligation to the respondents and will make no payment for any costs associated with the preparation or submission of the proposal.
- **3.9** EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY. During the performance of this Contract, the CONSULTANT agrees as follows:

The CONSULTANT will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex, age, national origin, place of birth, physical handicap, or marital status.

Commitment in the level of involvement of local MBE /WBE firms, consultants and employees will also be regarded in evaluating proposals.

Firms will be evaluated initially on the basis of the written qualification proposals. Thus, the proposal must be complete, concise and clear as to the capability and intent of the respondent. Further evaluation may include an oral presentation which will be scheduled after receipt of the written qualification proposal.

As such, to maintain competitiveness and to ease evaluation, responses to the RFP must be responsive to the following and presented in this format and order:

-Stability and Local Resources
-Experience and Qualifications
-Ability to Provide Services
-Local and MBE / WBE Participation (not scored)
-References (not scored)

V. <u>LOCAL / MBE / WBE PARTICIPATION</u> To include your use of local and MBE and WBE firm involvement. Indicate past efforts for local minority outreach and any current ongoing activities. Indicate proposed level of involvement for this contract.

- 4.2 <u>DISCRETION.</u> The County shall have sole discretion in evaluating both the responses and qualifications of the respondents. Please note that the evaluation committee will <u>recommend</u> the firms with the highest scores after all steps are complete, but it is the Board of Commissioners which, after consideration of staff's recommendations, makes the final contract award decision.
- **4.3 ASSIGNMENT.** The consultant shall not assign or transfer any interest in the contract without the prior written consent of the County.
- **4.4 <u>CONTRACT</u>**. The contract will be for one (1) year with automatic renewal options for four (4) additional one (1) year terms for an amount **not to exceed \$250,000 per year**. No guarantee is given to the amount of work a firm will receive over the three year period. NOTE: Selection of consultants will be done on a rotation basis with consideration of a firm's particular expertise in a certain areas. The selected firms will be

required to submit a Schedule of Hourly Rates to the Project Manager.

- **4.5 PERFORMANCE AND APPROVAL OF SUB-CONSULTANTS**. The consultant will perform the project as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee of the County. Objectives

Chatham County is seeking qualified consulting firms or organizations to provide Consultant Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Services. This Request for Proposal (RFP) seeks to identify potential providers for the Scope of Services listed below. Firms that respond to this RFP and are determined to be sufficiently qualified may be deemed eligible and invited to offer technical approach and/or possibly present and/or interview for these services. Chatham County reserves the right to reject any or all Statements of Qualifications or Technical Approach and to waive technicalities and informalities at the discretion of Chatham County. Prime consultants must be prequalified by the Georgia Department of Transportation in the Area Class 8.01 Construction Supervision. The Team (Prime Consultant and sub-consultants) must be prequalified by GDOT in the following area classes: 8.01 – Construction Supervision, 9.02 – Rainfall and Runoff Reporting, 9.03 – Field Inspections for Compliance of Erosion and Sedimentation Control Devices Installations at the time of submitting the Statement of Qualifications. Under the terms of the resulting Agreements, the selected consultants will provide Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Services for Chatham County.

- The Consultant shall provide CEI Services which are required for contract administration, construction inspection, documentation and general contract compliance for infrastructure projects for Chatham County. This work may require night and weekend inspections. The project types include but are not limited to new road construction, roadway widening and reconstruction, rehabilitation of asphalt and concrete pavements, resurfacing, bridge construction, trail and sidewalk construction, drainage repairs and upgrades, and construction and upgrades to County recreational facilities.
- The Consultant shall, at the discretion of the County Engineer, provide adequate staff who will be assigned to and work under the direct supervision of the County Engineer or his designated representative, on selected projects. These person's may include Project Engineers, Junior Project Engineers, Senior Inspectors, Bridge Inspectors, Advanced Traffic Management Systems (ATMS)/Signal Inspectors, Inspectors and Inspector Aids. The consultant will utilize effective control procedures to assure the Construction of the Project is performed in a reasonably close conformity with the plans, specifications and contract provisions. The Consultant should expect to provide one (1) to three (3) staff members per project.
- The Consultant shall:

- Perform to the satisfaction of the County all those construction engineering services necessary or incidental to accomplish the contract consistent with applicable professional standards.
- Monitor and inspect the Construction Contract such that the project is constructed in reasonable conformity with the plans, specifications and special provisions for the Construction Contract.
- Furnish all services and labor necessary to conduct and complete the services to accomplish the resulting contract, and shall furnish all materials, equipment, laptops, supplies, transportation and incidentals other than those designated in writing as to be furnished by Chatham County necessary to perform the services and check or test them prior to use under this contract. Each inspector will be required to have a vehicle equipped with an amber strobe light to be used in fulfilling the transportation needs of their inspection duties. Each inspector will also be required to have a smart phone and/or communication device such as a tablet of field hardened laptop computer cable of communicating with all project personnel.
- Perform all services in accordance with the established standard procedures and practices of the Georgia Department of Transportation and Chatham County.
 Prior to furnishing any services, the Consultant shall be familiar with those GDOT standard procedures and practices as set forth in GDOT's The Source and associated documents and with informal procedures and practices.
- The Consultant Project Manager shall periodically coordinate with the County Engineer as to staffing needs, inspector assignments and deployment of staff. The Consultant Project Manager will periodically review project records prepared by the Consultant Inspectors to assure services conform to Project requirements.
- The Consultant agrees to perform the following services as directed by the County Engineer:
 - Observe the Contractor's work to determine the progress and quality of work, identify discrepancies, report significant discrepancies to the County, and direct the Contractor to correct such observed discrepancies.
 - Attend conference(s) require to carry out the contract.
 - Become familiar with the standard construction practices of Chatham County, the construction plans and contract(s) for the project, and the Contractors proposed schedule of operations prior to beginning field services under the contract.

- Assign a sufficient number of technically qualified and experienced personnel to the project to perform the services required under the contract, in a timely manner to avoid delay to the Contractor.
- Notify the County Engineer and/or the County Project Manager immediately of any unanticipated project conditions.
- Withdraw any personnel or halt any services no longer required, at the request of Chatham County, or within a reasonable time after the lack of need becomes apparent to the Consultant.
- Perform consultant field operations in accordance with Chatham County and GDOT regulations and accepted safety practices.
- Provide for Consultant personnel transportation equipment with appropriate safety equipment, communication devices, hard hat, high visibility vests and incidentals as are needed to accomplish the services required under the contract. Communication devices shall be able to received and send email, texts and photos.
- Provide inspection duties as required as provided in the Specifications, Special Provisions and the Georgia Department of Transportations *The Source*.
- Ensure that test report records or certifications of compliance have been received prior to incorporation of materials into the work, for materials tested offsite.
- Oversee the sampling of materials, concrete and asphalt, to be incorporated into the work and reject Contractor's work and materials not meeting the Specifications, Special Provisions, or *The Source* of the Georgia Department of Transportation.
- Measure and compute quantities of materials incorporated into the work and items of work completed, and maintain an item record account.
- Keep daily diaries, logs and records consistent with GDOT practices as are needed for a record of the Contractor's progress including Project Engineer's diary and Inspector's diaries.
- Prepare and submit, such periodic, intermediate and final reports and records as may be required by the County and as are applicable to the project, which may include Traffic Interruption Reports, TC-1 and EC-1 reports, Weekly progress reports, weekly statement of working days, notice of change in construction status, report of field inspection of materials, test report record, contractor pay estimates, pile driving data, piling record, final certification of materials, explanation of quantity variation, statement of contract time, intermediate and final estimates,

contractor evaluation form, other records and reports as required for the individual project by the County Engineer.

- Review Contractor submittals of records and reports required by the County as applicable to the project with may include weekly payroll, statement of wage compliance, Disadvantage Business Enterprise (DBE) compliance, Associated paperwork relating to environmental compliance, request for partial and final payment, other reports and records as required for the individual project by the County Engineer, including Contractor EOO compliance.
- Collect, properly label or identify, and deliver to the County all original diaries, logs, notebooks, accounts, records, reports and other documents prepared by the Consultant in the performance of the contract, upon completion or termination of the contract.

Consultant Job Descriptions and Qualifications

- *Project Engineer* This is advanced level technical work in function areas or project administration and management. Employee, under limited supervision, independently manages construction actives on large complex projects such as complex bridge, urban or interstate reconstruction projects. Must have demonstrated experience managing complex construction projects, experience managing and training staff and performing moderately complex inspection on roadway and structure construction processes and materials. Must be Registered Professional Engineer in the State of Georgia (or able to obtain within 6 months) and a minimum of four (4) years of transportation technician experience. Employee shall be GDOT Worksite Erosion Control Supervisor (WECS) certification and GSWCC Level 1a Erosion Control Certification. Should have completed Project Management Training Program equivalent to GDOT Project Engineer's Academy or demonstrated experience managing projects in similar size and complexity.
- Senior Inspector This is an advanced level technical work supporting engineers in functional areas of structure and roadway construction inspection, materials sampling, inspection and testing. Employee will function as lead project

Engineer in Training certification, as well as GDOT WECS and GSWCC Level 1a Certification required. GDOT Field Concrete Technician Certifications preferred.
- Inspector This is general level technical work supporting higher level inspectors and engineers in functional areas such as construction inspection and surveying, scheduling and status, traffic signal equipment, traffic signalization and geometrics, and materials sampling, inspection and testing. Work usually involves a significant amount decision making and use of judgement, and may include providing work direction to others. Employee should have a demonstrated knowledge of materials, methods and equipment used in highway construction, and considerable knowledge of mathematical functions including geometry and trigonometry. Inspector shall have WECS certification, GSWCC Level 1a Certification and preferably GDOT Field Concrete Testing Certifications.
- Inspector Aid This is entry level inspector work supporting higher level inspectors and engineers on assignments relating to highway, bridge, drainage or other construction projects. Work is generally performed under technical and administrative supervision, and may include other duties and responsibilities as assigned. GSWCC Level 1a certification required.
- Bridge Inspector This is an advanced level technical work supporting engineers in functional areas of bridge and roadway construction inspection and materials sampling, inspection and testing. Employee supports engineers in management of construction activities on large complex bridge projects. Work usually involves a significant amount of decision making and use of judgment, and may include providing work directions to others. This position requires a

demonstrated knowledge of specifications and standards. acceptable construction practices, materials, methods and equipment used in bridge/highway construction and engineering. Candidates with a four (4) year degree shall have construction experience on a minimum of 4 complex bridges, those without a four (4) year degree shall have construction experience on a minimum of eight (8) complex bridges. GDOT Field Concrete Technician certification required.

ATMS/Signal Inspector – This is advanced level technical work supporting engineers in functional areas of roadway construction inspection and materials sampling, inspection and testing. Employee supports engineers in management of construction activities on ATMS and traffic signal projects. Work usually involves a significant amount of decision making and use of judgement, and may include providing work direction to others. Employee shall have the ability to read and comprehend traffic signal plans and specifications, ATMS plans and specifications, and all other documents associated with the project. This position requires a four (4) year degree and two (2) years of progressive transportation technician experience with ATMS/signal type projects, or a high school diploma or GED and a minimum of eight (8) years experience working on ATMS/signal type projects.

Contract Term and Amount

Chatham County anticipates that up to four (4) On-Call Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity contracts will be awarded. The annual contract amount will be not to exceed \$250,000. The contract will be a yearly contract with an option for four (4) additional one year renewals at the discretion of the County Engineer.
