RESPONSES OF QUESTIONS RECEIVED:

- 1. Q) What type of sod should be used for the bunker surrounds? And do you have a preferred grassing supplier?
- A) Certified 419 Bermuda is the sod of choice around the bunkers. The County has no preferred vendors.
- 2. Q) Do you have a preferred supplier for the certified bunker sand?
- A) There are several vendors that can supply the bunker sand. The County gets the majority of bunker sand from Golf Agronomics.
- 3. Q) Why are there 70 vaults in this project if there are only 23 bunkers?
 A) That is only an approximate number. An absolute number to be installed is undetermined at this time. It has been determined that some of the bunkers have multiple vaults. This is a unit cost item, therefore, the County will pay only for the actual number installed.
- 4. Q) Do we need to provide pricing to include a clean-out /blowout at the high end of the interior bunker drainage line for each bunker?
 A) Yes, as for the clean-out / blowout, there should be one on the main line running through the bunker.
- 5. Q) Please confirm the dump/stockpile location(s) for the removal of existing sand and stripped sod material. Near the cart barn @ #1 tee?
 - A) The sand removed from the bunkers can be stockpiled in a location chosen by the superintendent. Any materials such as sod and pea gravel will have to be removed to the parking lot and then removed from the premises.
- 6. Q) Will there be any permits that we will need pull from the County in order to perform the work ?

A) No. All work is done on Chatham County property; not in the right of way, so no permits required.
