Students in 7th through 12th grade can participate by completing 10 hours of community service with a recognized Non-Profit Organization. The first 50 students submitting verified community service hours will receive amazing prizes!

How to Participate:

1. Complete 10 hours of community service with a recognized Non-Profit Organization.
2. Submit the following documentation to Parla Parker, Public Information Officer, at piparker@chathamcounty.org
 - A letter from the Non-Profit Organization verifying the completed service hours.
 - Parent/Guardian Information (Name, Phone Number, Address).
 - Child's Information (Age, Grade, School).
